


The Girl Scout Cookie Program is a Learning Adventure For All Ages

Girl Scouts of the USA has teamed up with Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands, SETI Institute, ARIES, University of Arizona, and the Astronomical Society of the Pacific to create a new series of space science badges in collaboration with NASA! GSSC-MM is one of only ELEVEN councils selected to pilot this program!

Our Girls are piloting the badges by:

- Learning about space science and engaging in scientific inquiry while they explore the sky
- Developing communication skills through the opportunity to provide feedback on the badges

The Great American Eclipse will be here August 21st!

Wow, what a day this will be! Of course the weather needs to be just right, and you MUST use special eye protection to look at the sun whenever it is not totally eclipsed! About 2:36:02pm, the shadow of the great 2017 total eclipse first touches the final state in its path, South Carolina. Greenville is a very large city, and it is fully in shadow by 2:38pm. Its sister city of Spartanburg, however, is split by the path - you'll want to head west, and enjoy Greenville's two minutes and 14 seconds of totality.

Looking directly at the Sun is unsafe except during the brief total phase of a solar eclipse ("totality"), when the Moon entirely blocks the Sun's bright face, which will happen only within the narrow path of totality.

How to view an eclipse safely:



The only safe way to look directly at the uneclipsed or partially eclipsed Sun is through special-purpose solar filters, such as "eclipse glasses" or handheld solar viewers. Homemade filters or ordinary sunglasses, even very dark ones, are not safe for looking at the Sun. Please be sure to research and see what other options there are for viewing. We now carry eclipse-approved glasses in our GIRLZ GEAR stores!

Here is an activity you can do at home!

SUN TRACKING

What Is This About?

Long before humans kept track of time with mechanical clocks, atomic radiation, or computer chips, they used the Sun to tell time. As the Earth spins around like a top, the Sun appears to move across our sky. This movement causes shadows to move and change over the course of a sunny day. The simplest Sun tracker is called a gnomon, pronounced "no min." A gnomon casts a shadow, and can be as simple as a vertical pole. It can be used to track time on its own, or to measure time in hours and minutes as part of a sundial.

Materials

- Vertical pole, stick (straight branch, stake, pencil)
- Open location on a sunny day
- Rocks or other markers, 3 or more

What To Do

If you are installing your own stick as a temporary gnomon,

- Find a clear, sunny space with soft dirt
- Press the stick straight down into the ground until it stands up on its own
- Find your gnomon's shadow and mark the shadow's end with a rock
- Decide when you can return to your gnomon, at least 30 minutes later
- Estimate where the gnomon's shadow will be at this future time
- Place a second rock at the location of your guess
- Groups can make multiple guesses with more rocks
- Return to your gnomon after the planned amount of time

Check your guess. Is the rock close to the shadow? Did the shadow move more, less, or differently than you expected? Based on this movement, where do you hypothesize the shadow might be if you waited the same amount of time again? If you have time, guess again check back a second time. Did the shadow move as you expected?


Make a Pocket Sun Clock

Materials

- 7 inches (20 centimeters) of string
- Sun Clock print out
- Tape
- Scissors


Make a simple Pocket Sun Clock. Pick the pattern for your location, and print on heavy paper or glue onto cardstock. Cut out the Sun Clock, and carefully cut the short notch at each end. Fold along the dotted line, with the print on the inside. Take about 7 inches (20 centimeters) of string, and place the ends through the notches. Tape one end to the back of the clock. Make the string tight when the two parts of the clock are at a 90 degree angle. Tape the second end of the string to the back of the clock.

Take the Pocket Sun Clocks outside on a sunny day. Ask the Girl Scouts to place the clocks on a flat surface and experiment with them until they tell the right time. Which way are the clocks facing? Is there only one correct position? If possible mark the position on the ground, and return about an hour later to experiment again. Any changes?



Eyes to the Sky: A Once in a Lifetime Destination

We are hosting 48 girls at Camp WaBak for this amazing adventure. We have girls coming from 16 states and 23 councils to join our own Girl Scouts for this once in a lifetime opportunity. They will start their adventure with a space themed lunch before they head off to learn and have fun at Roper Mountain Science Center, Challenger Learning Center, and The SC State Museum and Planetarium. They will test their problem-solving skills as they engage deeper in robotics, rocketry, and aviation. They will make new friends while they plan for their day together viewing the Total Solar Eclipse from Camp WaBak.

Volunteer Experience: Equipping Volunteers for Easy Success



It's about fit.

Your volunteer position should make good use of your skills and interests – so let us know if you'd like to consider shifting to a different role that better fits your time constraints, and your skills and interests.

Troop Co-Leaders

Work together to provide a quality Girl Scout Leadership Experience through service to the girls assigned to their troop. The team structure allows each volunteer to maximize his or her skills as they pertain to troop leadership.

Troop Specialists

Work with a troop as a consultant in a special area, i.e. the arts, financial literacy, service/take action projects, STEM, and trip planning or to fulfill the requirement for a First Aid/CPR certified adult or Outdoor Skills certified adult.

Adult Learning Facilitators

Work with council staff to train potential and current volunteers as well as provide enrichment opportunities to enhance the volunteers' abilities to help girls lead.

Event Volunteers

Help throughout the year at large council organized activities for girls which could include STEM events, programming for older girls, outdoor education, cookie rallies...just to name a few!

Individually Registered Girl (IRG) Program Advisors

Provide quality leadership experience for girls who are not able to participate in a traditional troop; organize opportunities for these girls to come together, sell cookies, attend summer camp, and participated in a yearly Special Event.

Program Specialists

Share a special skill like outdoor cooking, archery or orienteering during a council sponsored event, lead a session at one of outdoor programs like Core Troop Camp and Back In the Woods, or run a check-in table at one of our events across the region.

Product Program Volunteers

Volunteer Experience: Volunteer Toolkit



Girl Scouts provides troops with an online one-stop resource: The Volunteer Toolkit (VTK). This will help keep troops organized and troop years exciting; not to mention easy to plan. To get started, go to www.gssc-mm.org and click "My GS." Since it is mobile friendly, everything this resource has to offer is available wherever and whenever you need it! There is more information about all the features of the Volunteer Toolkit on our council website in the "Volunteers" section.

Year Plans

With this feature, Daisy, Brownie and Junior troops can choose either a pre-written year plan or create their own custom year plan. Cadette, Senior and Ambassador troops have access to create their own custom year plan.

The pre-written year plans will pre-populate the agendas for all of your meetings based on the meeting dates you specify. This will help leaders and parents to see that it really is possible to do a lot of awesome things in one Girl Scout year. Leaders can change the order of meetings, edit meeting agendas, change activities, as well as email the information to each other and parents. Through the VTK, leaders can easily add additional meetings or activities, such as trips or special events (i.e. ceremony).

Plan with the girls! If a volunteer is a Daisy, Brownie, or Junior leader, they can use the



pre-written plans as a guide for involving the girls in the planning process. To help keep track of important events, GSSC-MM will add important dates throughout the Girl Scout year to show up in troop Year Plans as "Milestones." These orange banners appear in chronological order along with troop meetings and activities.

Meeting Agendas

Troops can edit the full agenda for any meeting and meeting aide resources. When a troop

creates additional meetings or activities, they can add in resources from the VTK library onto a blank agenda. The VTK serves as the go-to place for everyone in a troop to see important information about meetings and activities (such as locations, times, and what materials are needed).

Troop Finances

Troops will be able to easily track and report troop income and expenses during the year as well as upload information needed for end of year council reporting.

Parents have read-only access to meeting agendas and end of year troop finances in the VTK. This allows them to stay up to date on everything their daughter is enjoying in Girl Scouts!



Financial Literacy Skills through our Product Programs

Product programs are a popular and proven life skill component of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. Product programs assist girls in developing their self-confidence through entrepreneurial and financial literacy activities while simultaneously providing them with the funds to experience additional adventures. The five important skills that girls “learn by doing” through product sales are goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics.



The Girl Scout Cookie Program is our premier business enterprise activity. Selling cookies is a tradition that dates back to 1917 when Girl Scouts began selling home-baked cookies to raise money to help their troop and community. Since then, the activity has grown into an opportunity for girls to practice leadership while earning money for their troop and council activities.

In addition to the life skills Girl Scouts gain from their hands-on participation, troops earn money to carry out their troop activities and also help ensure the future of Girl Scouting in our communities. All revenue generated by the Girl Scout Cookie Program goes directly to troops or is designated for program services that directly support girls and/or adult volunteers in our 22-county area. Girls take orders in January; then deliver cookies and conduct direct sales in February and March. However, girls may continue taking orders throughout the sale.



Participants

Event Cancellation Policy

Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands reserves the right to cancel an event due to insufficient registration, acts of nature, or any other reason beyond its control. Council-sponsored events are held rain or shine, unless inclement weather adversely affects the program. If an event is cancelled or rescheduled, registered participants will be notified and refunds processed accordingly.

Refunds

The council and our community partners start planning long before the date of the actual program. Staff and volunteers are secured, food and supplies purchased, and sometimes other girls are turned away because you have registered to be there. Refunds will only be offered in the following circumstances:





Girl Scouting's highest awards are integrated with the leadership Journeys. The Award Project emphasizes leadership throughout the project, community focus, living the Girl Scout Law, sustainability, and attention to impact.



GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award in Girl Scouting and is earned individually by Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors. Each girl's Take Action project must encompass a minimum of 80 hours to complete the Girl Scout Gold Award. The Gold Award Girl Scout has demonstrated outstanding accomplishments in the areas of leadership, community service, career planning, and personal development. Girl Scouts, parents, and advisors are encouraged to register and attend an orientation before submitting Gold Award proposals.



GIRL SCOUT SILVER AWARD

The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest award a Girl Scout Cadette can earn. Girls may work individually or in a group of 2-4 to lead a Take Action Project which improves their own lives and their community. This award has a 50 hour minimum.



GIRL SCOUT BRONZE AWARD

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest award a Girl Scout Junior can earn. Working as a group, girls complete a minimum of 20 hours while leading a Take Action Project to improve the community.

Girl Scout Scholarships

Girl Scouts have many scholarship opportunities that are provided by GSUSA, various organizations, as well as 2 scholarships that our provided through our Mountains to Midlands Council.

Chandler-Burns Scholarship

This generous gift for girls is made possible by the Chandler-Burns family, whose women have a three-generation history of Girl Scout membership. Mountains to Midlands awards this scholarship up to \$1,000 annually to a college-bound Girl Scout who has earned the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor a girl can achieve in Girl Scouting. Applicants from Richland and Lexington counties will be given preference.

Pauline Patterson Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in May 2000 to honor the memory of Pauline M. Patterson, a very special friend and colleague. Mrs. Patterson was a staff member of one of Mountains to Midlands' legacy councils, the Old 96 Girl Scout Council, and was the Council's first Older Girl Program Specialist. As a tribute to Pauline Patterson's enthusiasm for life and learning, Mountains to Midlands is pleased to award this \$500 scholarship annually to a high school senior for college tuition.

Destinations Fund

Thanks to the Fall Product Program, we have a travel scholarship fund available for any older girl that is accepted and attends a destination or Girl Scout Leadership institute as identified by GSUSA. The council will provide up to \$500 to be paid toward the destination's program fee. Each girl must notify the Manager of Awards, Partnerships, and Destinations, girlawards@gssc-mm.org that she has accepted the invitation by sending a copy of the event acceptance letter. This travelship will be paid directly to the destination's sponsoring council.

D-Pass Grant from GSUSA

If selected to receive the D-Pass Grant, our council could assist girls up to 90% of their travel cost to the destinations program. The amount each girl is awarded is based on predetermined criteria posted on our website.



Susu FUNd Travel

This bi-annual council-sponsored international travel opportunity to one of four World Centers is designed for Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors who meet eligibility requirements. The next will be during summer of 2019. The application deadline is April 1st. Thanks to the generosity and vision of Susan Phifer Johnson, a significant portion of the program expenses are provided through the SUSU FUND. This travel adventure will involve girls in the planning, budgeting and money-earning, as well as preparations to experience the culture of the country. When they return they will share highlights of their experience with other Girl Scouts and encourage them to travel to enhance their understanding of other parts of the world.

At the October Session, the National Council will:

Elect National Board Officers

- Vote on three proposals that will impact the future
- Receive the Stewardship Report of the National Board
- Give input on major lines of policy

With nearly 8,000 individual Girl Scouts ages 14 years and older coming together to impact the Movement's future, the Key Proposals include:

1. Reducing the size of the National Board from 30/31 to 20/21 with no more than 15 at-large members.
2. Establishing the National Board Development Committee as a Standing Committee.
3. Amending the credentials of The Blue Book of Basic Documents, related to lifetime membership dues and categories.

While these are the topics, your elected National Council Delegates will learn more about the final phrasing, additional information, and the proposal sequencing.

Girl Scout Governance in Action

Decisions are made by those who engage. As a ‘federated’ organization, the Girl Scouts operate like the democratic process that our country was founded upon.

As volunteers in this organization, you have the opportunity to be a part of our council’s future through your voice, actions, and engagement in discussions, forums, and business meetings that drive our continuous improvement, strategic visioning, and generational goals. Here’s how:

Attend your **Town Hall Meetings**, held one or two times per year. This is a meeting to learn what is happening in the world of Girl Scouting today. Hear about the program and service plans at both the council and national level as well as learn and experience the new ways of supporting girls with quality program and making it as easy as possible for volunteers to give of their time. Town Hall Meetings focus on the operational work of the current membership year and serve as our feedback sessions for new plans or ideas. As a registered member, all you need to do is RSVP to attend.

In contrast, **Delegate Meetings** focus on the strategic, future plans for our council in the years ahead. Delegates, age 14 years+, are elected from each Service Unit. Serving as a conduit of information sharing, your Service Unit’s elected Delegates are charged with voicing your feedback directly to the Board of Directors on key advocacy, policy, and asset decision making. As a Service Unit Delegate, you are charged with keeping your area’s volunteers informed about the governance work of the Movement at both the council and national level. Interested in learning more about the inner-workings of Girl Scouting? Peruse the Service Unit Council Delegate Guide – elections take place within your service unit between October and December.

REFERRALS

The Governance Committee of the Board of Directors is charged with the cultivation and development of current and potential Board Members and Committee Members. Each year, an appeal is made for candidate referrals that would provide the identified skills and experiences that are being sought in the board profile and review process. Your help is needed stewarding potential board and committee volunteers is a year-round process. If you know a person that would be an asset to the leadership of the organization and has a gift that aligns with the key skill and knowledge areas, please let us know by completing the online referral form.

Girl Scouts of the USA's (GSUSA) Public Policy and Advocacy Office selects Girl Scout councils and state networks across the country to be Advocacy Champions for the national Live Healthy, Lead Healthy Policy and Advocacy initiative. This initiative equips and empowers Girl Scout councils to lead efforts to address and ultimately change issues that impact the health of girls at the state and local level. The Advocacy Champions use the Live Healthy, Lead Healthy Policy and Advocacy Roadmap, a toolkit that focuses on the following issue areas – relational aggression, healthy media images, and eating disorders – to become a voice for girls in their community and state.

Our council works in partnership with GSUSA staff to position Girl Scouts as the voice for girls in South Carolina and at the national level. Together, Advocacy Champions will help advance the Girl Scout Movement and improve girls' lives through legislative awareness and education to address issues that impact girls related to healthy media images.

GSUSA established the Girl Scouts Advocacy Network—a grassroots network where Girl Scout members, staff, alumnae, high school age girls, and the general public can act on issues moving through Congress and the state legislatures that are important to girls and Girl Scouts.

The Girl Scouts Advocacy Network provides a tool for you to make a difference in your community and across the nation. By being an advocate, you can help be a voice for girls. Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands, Inc. has been selected as an Advocacy Champion council and we are working in partnership with the Girl Scouts of Eastern South Carolina to mobilize our own grassroots network of supporters.

In addition to meeting with our elected representatives, girls are active at the capital for the annual Legislative Day and Page Week programs. Representing the year the organization was formed, the Honorary Girl Scout Troop of 1912 was created and extended to every female elected representative serving South Carolina through the South Carolina Women's Caucus.

To assist our work, we have joined forces with our sister council serving the State of South Carolina and have jointly retained the McNair Firm, supported by Lynn Stokes Murray. They remind us that decisions are made by those who show up. In the fast paced and dynamic world of the legislative process and the political arena, it is important for those impacted by legislative and regulatory actions to be a part of the process with the end goal of impacting services for girls through lobbying, advocacy, political strategy, messaging, coalition-building, and capacity enhancement.

Q How do I register for adult learning courses?

A Review the calendar on our website and select a session that fits into your schedule. Register online at www.gssc-mm.org or complete the Adult Learning Registration form found on our website.

Q May I attend sessions at any of the locations listed?

A Yes, you may choose the adult learning session that is most convenient for you.

Q Why do I need to register for a session?

A Registration is necessary for all adult learning sessions to allow the volunteer adult learning facilitator time to prepare for the class and to ensure that enough course materials will be available for participants. Non registered participants place an unreasonable burden on registered participants, the facilitator, and the host site. Please register at least four (4) days before the sessions. For CPR/FA, and Sleep-Out, please register 14 days prior to the scheduled date. Sessions may be cancelled due to low registration. If a session is cancelled, registered participants will be notified via phone, e-mail, or mail.

Q What happens if the minimum number of participants is not met?

A Sessions that do not meet the minimum number of registered participants will be cancelled. Only registered participants will be notified by telephone, mail, or e-mail. Please note: You are not confirmed until you receive notification from council. If you are unsure about your confirmation, then please contact a member of the Volunteer Experience team.

Q Is there a cost for adult learning courses?

A Most courses are offered at no cost. When a fee is charged, it covers the cost of equipment and materials. Fees must accompany your completed registration form or be paid online.

Sessions with fees include:

- CPR/FA
- Camp We Can
- Firebuilding
- Sleep In
- Sleep Out

CPR/FA is offered free of charge to one adult per troop per year for the adult who will serve as the troop's first-aider. Choose a session listed in the calendar. Register online at www.gssc-mm.org or by completing the Adult Learning Registration form, found on the Council website.

Fees will be refunded upon course completion to those who qualified for a free training.

Q How can I pay for a course?

A Registration secured online can only be paid by debit or credit card. Registration using paper forms can be paid by cash, check, money orders, debit or credit cards. Please do not send cash through the mail.

Q How will I know I've successfully registered for a session?

A Session confirmations will be mailed or e-mailed once the session has been filled and confirmed.

Q What do I bring to my session?

A You will find a list of items to bring in each course description and in your confirmation letter.

Q What should I do if I need to cancel my registration?

A To cancel, please notify the Volunteer Experience Team at any service center as soon as possible.

Q If I cancel my registration, will my payment be refunded?

A In most cases, refunds or a session transfer will be allowed when requested at least three business days prior to the session. This may not be possible if fees to outside consultants have been paid, or if food and other supplies have been purchased. Check with the Volunteer Experience Team for questions on a particular session. Individuals who do not show up for a session without giving prior notification may forfeit a refund or transfer.

Q What happens if I arrive late to a session?

A Arriving more than 20 minutes late or leaving 20 minutes early may result in not receiving credit for taking the course. Please be considerate of our volunteer adult learning facilitators and other participants in the session.

Q May I bring my child with me?

A In order to create a safe, comfortable, learning-friendly environment, children are not permitted at adult learning sessions. Please make arrangements for child care.

Q Will a record be kept of the Girl Scout adult learning sessions I attend?

A An attendance record is kept for each session.

This information is transferred into your volunteer records in our membership system. Please be sure to bring your training record card to each training. If you don't have one, then your facilitator can provide one to you.

Q Do I have to complete courses in person?

A Some of the courses are available online and/or through self-study courses. Check our course descriptions for online options.

Q Is training from another Girl Scout Council or another agency transferable?

A If the courses taken are equivalent, then credit can be transferred. You must provide documentation of the training taken. Contact the Volunteer Experience Team to discuss your situation.

Q How can I participate in additional adult learning opportunities?

A Attend your service unit meetings. Additional sessions may be announced or conducted at these meetings. Give suggestions for additional adult learning opportunities to the Volunteer Experience Team. Take advantage of adult learning opportunities in your community that might support your Girl Scout leadership role.

Q Who do I contact if I have questions about adult learning?

REQUIRED COURSES

REQUIRED COURSE – Girl Scouting 101 Online

Girl Scouting 101 is available online through the Girl Scouts of the USA website (Go to <http://training.girlscouts.org> choose Girl Scouting 101) This self-paced online orientation is available in English or Espanol. You'll be introduced to the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, utilizing Journeys and the Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting. Volunteers will also learn ways to make a difference in girls' lives.

Cost? Free

How long will it last? 45 minutes

What to bring? Volunteer Essentials

REQUIRED COURSE – Mountains to Midlands 101

Welcome to Girl Scouting! This course is an introduction to your council, Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands, and to the Girl Scout troop leader position. Topics include the role of the leader/leadership team, troop registration, working with parents, council structure and policies, safety, and getting started. These classes may also be conducted one-on-one or in a small group led by a local staff member or designated volunteer facilitator.

Cost? Free

How long will it last? 1-2 hours and includes a self-study participant guide. Sessions with larger attendance may take longer to complete.

Prerequisite? The individual must have completed a volunteer application and be progressing through the volunteer screening process. GS101 to be taken online first.

What to bring? Resources will be provided at the session.

ENRICHMENT TRAININGS

VOLUNTEER TOOLKIT TRAINING

Looking for a way to organize your troop year to make it the most exciting year yet for your girls? New and experienced leaders will learn about the brand new digital resource known as the Volunteer Toolkit (VTK). This recorded webinar will walk you through all of the functionalities of the system including Year Plans, Meeting Agendas, and Troop Finances. The online resource is revolutionizing the way girls and leaders organize their troop year!

Computer access required.

How long will it last? 45 minutes

GRADE LEVEL LEADERSHIP TRAINING

New and experienced leaders will enjoy a comprehensive training on what makes each grade level unique and a step-by-step guide on how to plan your first four troop meetings and incorporate the 10 Essential Elements into your troop experience. Learn about specific developmental abilities for each age group, grade-level specific opportunities, and take an in-depth look into the National Program Portfolio.

There will be separate trainings for Daisy, Brownie, Junior, Cadette, and Senior/Ambassador levels.

Training will be available in person with a refresher course online.

Minimum? 10 or based on facilitator's discretion

How long will it last? 2 hours

GIRL SCOUT WAYS – online training opportunity

New to Girl Scouts and needing more information about Girl Scout ceremonies, songs, and traditions? Are you a veteran leader wanting a refresher about special GS ways? This online opportunity will provide the necessary information to acquaint you with what makes Girl Scouts timeless as well as an overview of the grade level Girl Scout Ways badges.

Computer access required.

How long will it last? 1 – 1 ½ hours

COUNCIL FACILITIES – online training opportunity

Interested in taking a trip with your girls but want to learn more about what our council properties have to offer? This online opportunity will take you through all of our council properties, what they have to offer, and what's available in the surrounding areas. Online resources will also be available to help plan your next troop outing.

Computer access required.

How long will it last? 1 hour

TRIP PLANNING AND OUTDOOR SKILLS

PLANNING TRIPS – online training opportunity

This course is required if your troop is planning an overnight trip where you will be staying in a hotel and eating out.

You can take this course as a self study course, and become acquainted with a number of great resources. Go to the Volunteer tab on our website and select Online Support for Volunteers. Be sure to take the quiz when you have finished your self-study so we can record that you have completed it. Planning Trips DOES NOT replace Sleep-In for overnight qualifications where cooking is involved.

Computer access required.

How long will it last? 1 1/2 hours



SLEEP-OUT (OUTDOORS OVERNIGHT) – OUTDOOR III

This course teaches adults to work with girls to prepare for troop camping. Sleep-Out is required for troops planning to cook outdoors and/or camp at sites utilizing bunkhouses, platform tents or pitched tents. The course includes group preparation, minimal impact camping, safety, and cooking in the out-of-doors.

Prerequisite? Sleep-In (Outdoor II)

Minimum? 10 or based on facilitator's discretion

Cost? \$20

How long will it last? This course includes an overnight stay

Sleeping Accommodations: Tents or Cabins (depends on session/location)

ENCAMPMENT/EVENT PLANNING

This course is designed for volunteers planning a Service Unit overnight encampment or large event. It includes program planning, age-appropriate programming, safety, use of facility's equipment and building space, budgeting, and planning large scale meals.

How long will it last? 1 1/2 hours

Please contact a member of the Volunteer Experience staff if interested.

CAMP WE CAN (INTRODUCTION TO THE OUTDOORS) – OUTDOOR I

This course is an optional introduction to the outdoors for volunteers who are looking to ease their girls into the wonders of what nature has to offer. This training is not a prerequisite for Sleep In or Sleep Out. Camp We Can and Firebuilding are suggested for troops that are looking for an outdoor experience, but not yet ready to camp.

Minimum? 10 or based on facilitator's discretion

Cost? \$5

How long will it last? 2 hours

SLEEP-IN (INDOORS OVERNIGHT) – OUTDOOR II

This course is required for a troop to spend the night in a self-contained facility (an indoor facility with kitchen and bathroom). Adults will gain skills for working with girls to plan and carry out an overnight, including program and meal planning. A snack is provided. Sleep-In can count for Planning Trips, but Planning Trips does not replace Sleep-In.

Minimum? 10 or based on facilitator's discretion

Cost? \$5

How long will it last? 3 hours

CPR AND FIRST AID TRAINING

The health and safety of girls is the top priority in Girl Scouting. Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands offers a variety of courses to meet the needs of the volunteer who will act as the troop first-aider. Each troop is recommended to have an adult certified in CPR/FA to serve as the troop first-aider. A first-aider is an adult volunteer who has taken Girl Scout-approved first-aid and CPR training that includes specific instructions for child CPR. If, through the American Red Cross, National Safety Council, EMP America, or American Heart Association, you have a chance to be fully trained in first-aid and CPR, doing so may make your activity planning go a little more smoothly.

AMERICAN RED CROSS CPR, AED AND FIRST AID BLENDED LEARNING

Blended Learning gives the opportunity to complete CPR, AED and First Aid certification through a combination of online learning and a classroom skills session. Part One: Online learning includes the lecture segments of a regular classroom session and an online version of the test. Once you have successfully completed the online test, print the certificate to present to your instructor at the classroom skills session where you will demonstrate your CPR, AED and First Aid skills. Part Two: The classroom skills session includes video instruction and hands-on practice.

To participate in a CPR/FA session outside of Girl Scouting, register with the local provider. Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands will reimburse one adult per troop per year for the registration fee up to \$35. A copy of the reimbursement form, found on the Council website, along with a paid receipt from the provider must be submitted to the Volunteer Experience Manager for reimbursement.

Minimum/Maximum: 5/10

Cost? \$35 (without a course book)

How long will it last? 2½ hours

AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION HEARTSAVER CPR, AED, AND FIRST AID

This class meets the requirements for CPR and First Aid required for troop leaders. The class is taught in either two (2 ½ hour) sessions or one five hour session, by an instructor using the Heartsaver training videos. This course includes instruction and a classroom skills demonstration. Upon completion, certification is valid for two years. Child and infant CPR are also included. If you sign up for the two part series, you must attend Session 1 in order to attend Session 2.

To participate in a CPR/FA session outside of Girl Scouting, register with the local provider. Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands will reimburse one adult per troop per year for the registration fee up to \$35. A copy of the reimbursement form, found on the Council website, along with a paid receipt from the provider must be submitted to the Volunteer Experience Manager for reimbursement.

Minimum/Maximum: 5/10

Cost? \$35 (with a course book)

How long will it last? 4-5 hours

Troop Fall Product Manager Adult Learning Sessions

To review the 2017 Fall Product information prior to participating in the adult learning session, go to www.gssc-mm.org/FallProduct.

This online or face-to-face session is intended for ALL Troop Fall Product Managers and Troop Leaders. It will help you be prepared for planning, implementing and informing your girls and parents on the Fall Product Sale (nuts, candy, and magazines). This session will introduce you to the Fall Product Sale dates, benefits, product, recognitions (girl and troop), Nut.e online computer system, and paperwork. You will pick up the Fall Product materials from your Service Unit Fall Product Manager after completion of the course. *Volunteers must have a completed Background Check prior to attending/participating in the adult learning session. All participants must register online to attend/participate in the adult learning session.



The online course opens on August 24. Registration closes on September 8.

After you register, you will be sent a confirmation letter (within 24 hours – weekday or 48 hours – weekend) with further instructions. Materials must be picked up from your Service Unit Fall Product Manager after completion of the course (you must bring your certificate of completion). **Online courses must be completed on or before September 12 (11:59 PM).** When registering for the online option, look for the title of the training on the Adult Learning Calendar that is closest to the date you are registering.

How long will it last? 1 hour (face-to-face) and 55 minutes (online)
