<i>President's Award</i>	Service Delivery Team or Committee whose exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience surpassed team goals and resulted in significant measurable impact toward reaching the council's overall goals.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All service delivery team or committee members are registered Girl Scouts. • All service-delivery-team members have met all the requirements and expectations of the positions held. • The service delivery team has significantly contributed to meeting one or more of the council's mission delivery goals in one or more of the following functional areas: Membership Development/Community Cultivation, Volunteer Relations and Support, Program, Leadership and Governance, Fund Development, Council Support Service (IT, Customer Service, Merchandising, Marketing/Communications) • The service delivery team reflects the diversity of the target audience or area it serves, in girl and adult membership, in all pathways offered. • The service delivery team actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Submit a nomination form by early March (check website for specific date), along with supporting documentation, indicating how the nominees meet the criteria. • The recognition committee reviews the nomination documentation, then approves or denies it. • The award is presented to the recipients at the council Volunteer Recognition Celebration and Dinner.

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Volunteer Years of Service Pin	To recognize volunteers for their years of active volunteer service. (at 5-year intervals)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a registered Girl Scout adult and active member of Girl Scouts of South Carolina – Mountains to Midlands, Inc. • Include the number of years of active volunteer service in the Girl Scout Movement. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Efforts will be made to collect the information from the volunteers in each service unit so that it can be submitted to the Volunteer Experience Manager by early March (check website for specific date). • Individuals who are not closely associated with a service unit may submit their request directly to the Volunteer Experience Manager by the March deadline. • Those who have completed 5 Volunteer Years of Service are recognized at the service unit level in the spring. • Volunteer Years of Service of 10 years or more (in five--year increments) are recognized at the council Volunteer Recognition Celebration and Dinner.
