





# CAMP WABAK

While at Camp WaBak campers have the opportunity to participate in a variety of session themes as well as enjoying camp activities which include swimming, canoeing, hiking, arts and crafts, creek hiking, outdoor cooking, and Girl Scout Journey activities.

This summer, session themes were developed using Girl Scout Badges and Girl Scout Journeys. Listed at the end of each session description is the badge or journey that the girls will be working on. Campers will receive a list of requirements completed during their session along with the actual badge or a journey book. Journey activities will also be incorporated into the program throughout the summer.

## WHAT IS CAMP LIFE LIKE?

Campers live in a shared environment. All campers are expected to participate daily in camp kapers (making their beds, maintaining their living space, rotating responsibilities for table setting and cleanup). Each camper is responsible for her own personal care and grooming. This provides an excellent opportunity for girls to develop democratic living skills and a greater sense of self-reliance and responsibility. The Girl Scout Leadership Experience is utilized during the week to provide girls with an opportunity to discover something new about themselves, connect with the natural world, and take action to make the world a better place.

## CAMP WABAK LIVING UNITS

Camp WaBak offers campers the opportunity to stay in four unique units. Unit assignments are given to campers on the first day of camp at check in. Criteria used to assign housing include the following: age level of campers, program size, and program theme.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Sessions designed for girls 4th grade and up stay in units where the counselors stay in a separate cabin/tent from the girls. Please refer to the calendar schedule and unit descriptions for more details. Sessions with a “cabin” picture indicate units/sessions where counselors are housed in the same cabin as the campers.



**PATHFINDER** One large bunkhouse with bunk beds, electricity, and a common area. Restrooms and showers facilities are located near the bunkhouse.

**Counselors are housed in the bunkhouse but in a separate room. All Brownie programs are housed in this unit.**

**PIONEER** Seven platform tents with beds. Restrooms and shower facilities are separate buildings located within the unit. **Counselors are housed in a separate tent in the unit.**

**GYPSY** Five cabins with bunk beds and electricity. Restroom and shower facilities are separate buildings located within the unit. **Counselors are housed in a separate cabin in the unit.**

**RAMBLER** Five cabins with bunk beds and electricity. Restrooms and shower facilities are located in each of the five cabins. **Counselors are housed in a separate cabin in the unit.**

## CHOICE ACTIVITIES

This summer girls will have the opportunity to plan and choose their morning camp activities! Campers will choose their activities with the help of their counselors Sunday after dinner. Campers will participate in the same two choice activities Monday – Thursday. Campers signed up for offsite trips will not participate in choice activity time. Instead they will work on preparing for their trip. Since the Girl Scout program is built on the concept of progression; there may be differences in the programming of morning activities depending on age level. Listed below are some examples of activities that may be offered.

**Please note:** Not all of the activities list below will be offered each week. On Sunday girls will have the opportunity to vote for their top choices of activities. This list will then be used to determine what will be offered to the whole camp for the week. Girls will then request their choice activities from this list.

### Examples of Choice Activities for girls in grades 2nd – 5th Grade

**CRAFTS** Campers will complete a different craft each day. Projects may include, but are not limited to, papermaking, bead buddies, candle making, pottery, leather crafting, mosaic art, the possibilities are endless!

**POOL TIME** Spend time each day at the pool doing something new! Learn new water games, do water aerobics, have water contests (for example most creative jump), or learn how to stay safe at the pool. Time will also be given to playing around on your own!

**NATURE GIRL** Each day discover a new area of camp! Spend time at the waterfall, hike Little Girl Hill, take time to explore the lake and the camp garden.

**WEIRD SCIENCE** If you like science experiments, you will really enjoy this! Each day you will experiment with different hands on science experiments. See who can build the best structure using marshmallows, toothpicks, and Jell-O or write secret messages using lemons, or participate in an egg drop.

**DANCE** – Does the music move you? Learn a new dance technique each day and choreograph a routine to perform Friday morning for the whole camp to enjoy!

**GAMES** – Play a new game every day! Some games will challenge you intellectually while others may challenge you to work as team to accomplish a task!

**CANOEING** - Learn all about canoeing and practice a new stroke every day. Participate in water games using your canoe and try your new skills on the water obstacle course.

**DRAMA** – Imagination is key for this activity! Get into character and play improv games, try on different costumes and come up with a skit to be shared with the rest of camp later in the week!

**OUTDOOR SKILLS** – Build a fire, try your hand at some knots and lashing, and learn how to correctly use a pocket knife. Put your skills to the test during your unit’s cookout!

**DESSERTS FIRST** – Learn how to make fun desserts and then try your creations! Girls will learn to measure, mix, bake, and decorate their creations!

**ARCHERY** – Girls in 4th – 5th grade will learn how to hold a bow and shoot an arrow. Each day girls will work on their archery techniques and learn how to safely shoot at a target!

### Examples of Choice Activities for girls in 6th – 10th Grade

**ARCHERY** – Learn how to hold a bow and shoot an arrow. Each day girls will work on their archery techniques and learn how to safely shoot at a target!

**BEADING & JEWELRY MAKING** – Girls will learn how to make beads out of clay, paper, and other materials. By the week’s end they will have a beautiful keepsake to take home!

**OUTDOOR LIVING SKILLS** – Girls will learn how to tie knots, build a small fire, construct a survival shelter, and learn how to use their pocket knife safely. Girls will also take their knowledge on a trail around camp and learn how to use their compass and read trail signs to point them in the right direction.

**HIKING** – Each day hike a different trail on or around camp! Examples of the possible hikes you can take include Little Girl Hill, Falls Creek Falls, WaBak Fall Creek Hike, Big Boy or a trail at Jones Gap State Park!

**TEAM BUILDING** – Do you like a challenge? Then this activity is for you! Work with other girls to solve problems and build friendships that will last a lifetime!

**CANOEING/KAYAKING** - Learn how to canoe and practice a new stroke every day, participate in water games using your canoe and try your new skill on the water obstacle course. Girls will also have the opportunity to learn how to swamp a canoe and do a canoe over canoe rescue.

**OUTDOOR COOKING** - Have you ever wanted to make a cake in a box oven or a stew in a Dutch oven – here is your chance! Each day girls will make something new and exciting using different outdoor cooking techniques.

**POTTERY** – Explore the process of turning clay into a finished piece of ceramic art. Discover different kinds of clay, types of glazes, and learn about the firing process. At the end of the week you will have some awesome pieces to take home!

**ECO-ART CHALLENGE** – Each day you will be given a challenge to create something new out of something old!

**WACKY SCIENCE** - Spend each day exploring the wacky world of science. Discover your inner scientist while exploring the world of forensic science, chemistry, and physics.
