Don't think you can write a poem? Everyone can! An easy way to get started is a haiku. A haiku is a traditional form of Japanese poetry. A haiku has 17 syllables in three lines and it describes a single moment, feeling or thing. Here's the "formula" with an example:

Title:	Mrs. Smith
1st line has 5 syllables:	Talented and kind
2nd line has 7 syllables:	Heroic and organized
3rd line has 5 syllables:	My awesome mentor
