Many of us thought 2021 would be a year of recovery. While we are still dealing with the pandemic, one thing we did learn was how to cope with it. We are stronger today. We will be stronger tomorrow and we are stronger together, because of everything we've overcome. Volunteers reached out more often to check on their girls, staff developed hybrid programs so everyone could benefit, and our donors recognized the difficulty of funding Girl Scouts when only 2 percent of donations are given to organizations that support girls.

We are grateful that we were able to hold some (safe) in-person programming, service unit meetings, and troop gatherings. With

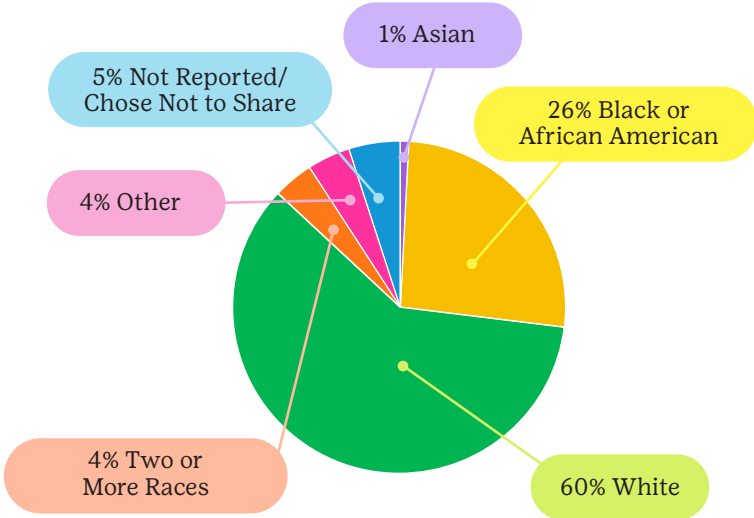
limited capacity we had girls at camp at both Camp WaBak and the Cathy Novinger Girl Scout Leadership Center. We hosted **340 girls at resident camp** and **207 girls at the inaugural day camp** at the Cathy Novinger Girl Scout Leadership Center. Girl Scouts is rooted in the outdoors and every outdoor adventure grows a Girl Scout's "I've got this" attitude. Once they unlock that confidence, they'll aim as high as the stars they see outside their cabin window. The pandemic did not stop girls from participating in the number one girl-led entrepreneurship program in the world! Despite a tough cookie season for councils around the nation, because of our planning we were not left with excess inventory this year and Girl Scouts increased their per girl average to 268 packages. In total, **3,267 girls in our council sold 878,268 packages of cookies**. Girl Scout troops earned \$652,497. GSSC-MM donated nearly 12,000 packages of Girl Scout Cookies to service members through Blue Star Mothers and the Red Cross.

We celebrated 21 Gold Award, 118 Silver Award, and 207 Bronze Award Girl Scouts. The Girl Scout Gold Award, Silver Award, and Bronze Award prove girls have what it takes to build a better today—and tomorrow. Girl Scouts shine brightest when they're making the world a better place. We celebrated these accomplished young women in person at Fluor Field. The outside venue was a perfect setting to safely recognize their accomplishments. Women of Distinction, although rained out for the most part, still honored incredible women in the Midlands. We were able to provide food through a drive-thru and the women we honored jumped out for some quick pictures. We held our first ever Sweet Weekend so donors could gather at home and cook, and **donors committed \$8,000 to GEM (Giving Every Month)**.

To our volunteers—with you, girls listen to their hearts, think on their feet, and raise their voices for what they believe in. You are their heroes—and ours too. Thank you!

Membership

Our focus this year was on retention and continued work on building the service unit teams. Attention was placed on volunteers and especially first year volunteers. We continued to feel the impact of the pandemic and faced challenges in recruiting new members. Our service unit team and volunteers are key to the success of membership and work continues in building the supporting the teams as we continue to grow membership. In 2021, our council served **5,208** girls and **2,604** adult members. We are proud to report our girl membership closely reflects the diversity of our 22-county jurisdiction.

Program

Membership Year 2021 saw a mixed approach to programming. Some events continued as virtual as we made our way through the pandemic, and slowly, we saw a return to in-person events. We continued the Signature Event approach with two in-person events:

- Back in the Woods
- Carolina Camporee

Additionally, in-person programs and even some overnights rounded out the program offerings at the Cathy Novinger Girl Scout Leadership Center (CNGSLC). We also partnered with the State Museum, League of Women Voters, and Junior League of Columbia—to name just a few—for some exciting programs. Summer resident camp made its in-person return in 2021 with limited capacity to allow for social distancing:

- Camp WaBak: 340 resident campers
- CNGSLC: 207 day campers

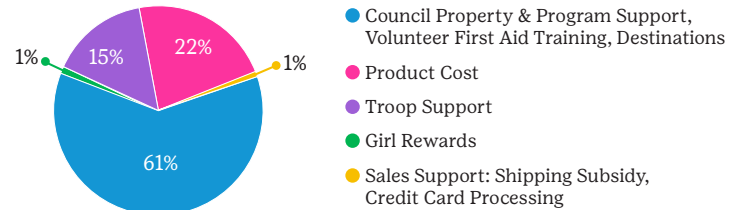


Girl Scout Cookie Program



- 3,267** girls sold **878,268** packages of cookies.
- Each participating girl sold an average of **268** packages.
- We partnered with Blue Star Mothers and the Red Cross to send **11,988** packages of cookies to service members.
- In addition to troop proceeds, girls earned **\$76,545** in Cookie Dough for use at the Girlz Gear Shops, for council-sponsored event and program fees, and more.
- 30 girls sold **1,500+** packages, and 1 girl sold **5,000+**.
- Troops earned **\$652,497**.

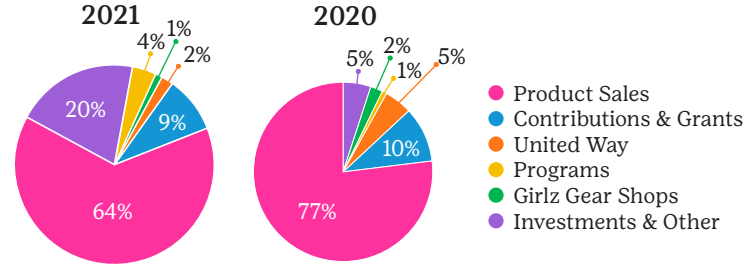

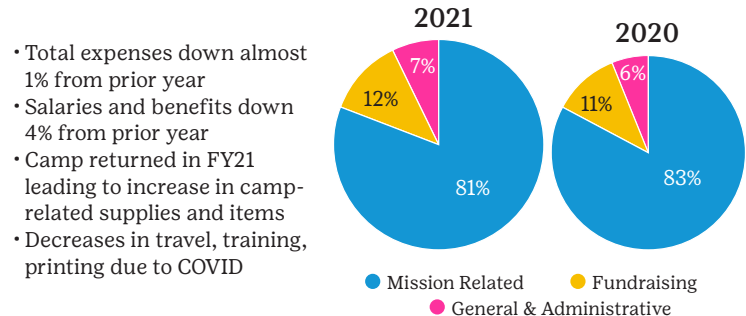
Fiscal Statement for the Year

Income FY2021



- Total income flat from prior year
- Overall fundraising down: United Way decreased and staff-led fundraising increased
- Product sales revenue down 22% (COVID-related membership decline)
- Revenue from investment income increased
- Increase in other income, including forgiveness of stimulus loan

Expenses FY2021



- Total expenses down almost 1% from prior year
- Salaries and benefits down 4% from prior year
- Camp returned in FY21 leading to increase in camp-related supplies and items
- Decreases in travel, training, printing due to COVID

Fundraising

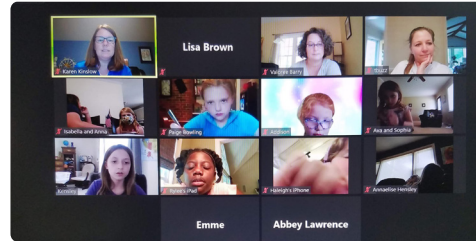
