

A NOTE FROM Meredith




In 2017, the Girl Scout Research Institute (GSRI) performed the first ever research report focused solely on the health and well-being of girls living in the United States. Unfortunately, the findings for our state of South Carolina looked grim. Overall, compared to the other 50 states, South Carolina ranked 40th when measured against 13 standards of well-being for girls. According to the study:

- · 26% of girls in South Carolina lived in poverty
- 78% of girls were not proficient in math
- 63% of fourth grade girls were not proficient in reading.

 Those statistics were just a few among many not favorable for South Carolina.

This is where the Cathy Novinger Girl Scout Leadership Center comes in. We have to improve the conditions and leadership climate for girls in South Carolina to thrive. The Girl Scout Leadership Experience has an undeniable positive impact on girls. Just look at these statistics to know this is true:

The Order of the Palmetto is the highest civilian honor awarded to citizens of South Carolina for extraordinary lifetime achievement, and for national or statewide service. This once in a lifetime achievement was awarded to longtime friend of Girl Scouts, Dodie Anderson, by Gov. Henry McMaster.
