



Camp WaBak

Camp WaBak is an overnight camping experience in the mountains of Greenville County for girls entering first through twelfth grades. We offer traditional, equestrian, tripping, and leadership sessions where girls will learn skills, explore the outdoors, and make new friends.

Traditional Sessions

Our traditional camp sessions give girls the opportunity to explore weekly themes through a girl-led lens. Campers work together in their grade-level group to plan their week and determine what activities they take part in. Themed activities are incorporated through badge work, individually-chosen activities, and camp activity sessions.

Equestrian Sessions

Equestrian camp offers various sessions to suit a range of riding skills. Campers will learn to work safely around horses, basic care, grooming, and saddling when not riding out in the arena. Girls may work on badge

requirements and explore special topics about horses. The weight limit for equestrian activities is 225 pounds.

All riders, beginning and intermediate, will be paired with a horse of appropriate temperament for a safe, fun session. Girls will be at the barn Monday through Thursday and will ride each day, weather permitting.

Tripping Sessions

Tripping programs are an opportunity for older campers to spend part of the week at camp and the other part on adventures like zip lining, ghost tours, and more. Tripping sessions are for rising eighth through twelfth grade girls.

Leadership Sessions

Leadership is core to the Girl Scout experience! During our CIT sessions, high school Girl Scouts learn to lead younger girls in an outdoor setting. Leadership sessions offer campers the opportunity to learn new skills, build confidence working with others, and have a blast at camp.


