Even better, Germany has a strong WAGGS tradition—so Girl Scouts may even get the chance to connect with local Girl Guides so they can bring their global insights back to their troop at home!

Program Highlights:

- Fully funded by the U.S. Congress and German Bundestag through the U.S. Department of State
- No prior German experience required—students become fluent through full immersion
- Open to U.S. citizens born between February 1, 2008, and August 1, 2011, with a 2.5+ GPA
- Application deadline: November 3, 2025

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Code, Create, and Command with IT-oLogy!

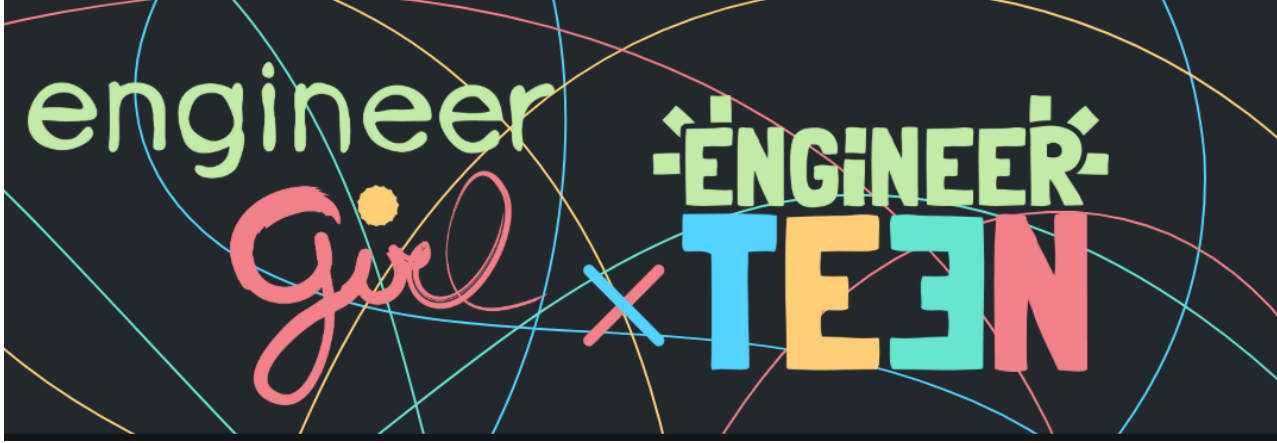
