What is the Super Troop Program? The Super Troop Program recognizes INCREDIBLE troops who live out the Girl Scout Movement in everything they do—from who they are, what they do, and how they serve their communities.

So, you want to be a Super Troop? Troop and groups can become Super Troops by completing activities in this packet and accumulating points. When you do something amazing, check the packet to see if it will help you reach Super Troop status! Each activity can only count towards one requirement—no double dipping! But we're sure your awesome troop will reach the required 400 points and become a Super Troop with no problem!

Details and Deadlines: All activities must be completed between July 1 and June 30 of the membership year you are submitting for. Yes, you can go back and count activities you've already done during that time frame! Your troop can submit its application as soon as you've reached 400 points—there's no need to wait until June.
